# PRIORITIZATION OF BUILDING INFORMATION MODELING FOR TRAINING REGULATIONS (TR) DEVELOPMENT

**WHEREAS**, Section 8, Paragraph 5 of Republic Act No. 7796 gives the TESDA Board the power to approve trade skills standards and trade tests as established and conducted by private industries, Section 14 – refers to functions of Skills Standards and Certification Office (SSCO);

**WHEREAS**, TESDA deems it necessary to focus its efforts and resources on priority qualifications/skills identified by partner-industry bodies and associations on the basis of the following:

- 1. Priority needs of the industry-sector;
- 2. Nationwide application in terms of public interest/welfare;
- 3. Employment generation and investment opportunities; and
- 4. The criteria for skills standardization and certification, to wit:
  - Requiring relatively long period of education or training;
  - Performance of the competency affecting and endangering people's lives and limbs; and
  - Competency involving the handling of complex equipment, tools and supplies.

WHEREAS, in addition to the abovementioned criteria, support for the development of skills/qualifications shall also be prioritized based on existing laws of the sector/industry governing the promotion on the competitiveness and promoting Filipino workers and the development thrusts of the government, among others;

**WHEREAS**, the Building Information Modeling framework, including relevant qualifications, have been presented and endorsed by industry associations and practitioners during the 32<sup>nd</sup> Direction Setting Committee Meeting of the TESDA Board on 9 August 2019;

WHEREAS, during the above-mentioned meeting, the qualifications under the Building Information Modeling framework were recommended to be elevated to the TESDA Board for prioritization for TR development, with the condition that: 1) the Building Information Modeling framework shall be affirmed by the Department of Trade and Industry as priority of the construction industry, and 2) the relevant industry association commits to establish a common training facility for construction
